to save us from hell. When Jesus suffered, shed His blood and died on the cross, all of our iniquities (lying, stealing, blasphemy, evil thoughts, etc...) were laid upon Him, and when He cried out "It is finished," the debt of sin had been fully paid. Only Jesus could have paid our sin debt, because He is the only one who had no sin of His own. Jesus "...was buried, and...he rose again the third day."









he hath no form nor comeliness; and when we shall see him, there is no beauty that we should desire him.




3 He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from him; he was despised,

6 All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on him the iniquity of us all.








12 Therefore will I divide him a portion with the great, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong;
